In a discussion directly, after the Audit meeting, the question was raised as to whether the one year extension should be automatically in the contract. On Monday, May 4, 2015 he notified Attorney Natalie Braswell that the vote was 9-0 in favor of taking that part of the wording out of the contract. Motion passes, there will only be a one year contract.
